#### **Dean Robert Harrington**



Dr. Safdieh earned a bachelor's degree in neuroscience, summa cum laude, from the College of Arts and Science of New York University in 1998 and his medical degree in 2002 from NYU Grossman School of Medicine, where he received the Alpha Omega Alpha Award for graduating first in his class. He completed his neurology residency training at NewYork-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center, where he also served as chief resident, and joined Weill Cornell Medicine's faculty in 2006.

Dr. Safdieh, in his new position as Senior Associate Dean for Education, has been one of the leaders overseeing the preparations for the LCME site visit. His participation with related affiliate issues has been invaluable.

#### **Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME)**

Weill Cornell Medical College is preparing for a site visit in April 2026 of the Liaison Committee on Medical Education.. The LCME is the accrediting body for medical education programs leading to the MD degree in the United States and it is sponsored jointly by the American Medical Association and the Association of American Medical Colleges. The goals of LCME accreditation are to certify that a medical education program meets the prescribed standards and to promote institutional self-evaluation and improvement. Our last visit was in March 2018, and WCM is currently in full compliance with the national standards set by the LCME. There is an 18-month preparation period for the next site visit. There are required documents to be prepared, one of which is the Data Collection Instrument, or DCI, divided into 12 standards. The DCI is comprised of narrative responses, data and supporting documentation of policies and procedures, tallies, curricular content, and student surveys. There is also the Graduate Questionnaire, or GQ, filled out by students at the time of graduation, and there is the Independent Student Analysis, or ISA, a questionnaire to be administered to the student body prior to the site visit. Also prior to the visit, an executive summary must be submitted, which is based on the work of several committees at the college, each tasked with examining a standard of the LCME. #### Physician Assistant Program



Kelly E. Ragusa Porta, DMSc, MSS, PA-C, has been named the new Associate Dean for Physician Assistant Studies and the Director of the PA Program. The Office of Affiliations has been actively involved in the Physician Assistant Program and is celebrating the success of the program. The Office of Affiliations has facilitated renewal agreements with Affiliate Institutions that are involved with the teaching of PA students. The PAP program is a Master of Science in Health Sciences for Physician Assistants in the medical school. Dr. Porta, who had previously been serving as interim director, earned her physician assistant certification from Saint Vincent Catholic Medical Centers, received her master's at Pace University, and completed a Doctor of Medical Science degree at Rocky Mountain University. She joined the WCM program as an instructor of physician assistant studies in medicine in 2020 and was honored that year with the Pi Alpha Honor Society PA Faculty Award. Prior to her stint as interim director, Dr. Porta served as PAP Program's Associate Program Director for Accreditation. The Physician Assistant Students rotate at the Affiliated Hospitals.

#### Faculty Participation Opportunity

#### **Applications for Longitudinal Clinical Mentors Program**

The Office of Medical Education at Weill Cornell is pleased to share opportunities for faculty participation in key areas of the medical education program, as Clinical Mentors for facilitating small group sessions and bedside teaching. Prerequisite: Current active clinical practice or recently retired (within 5 years), and a current WCM faculty appointment. Faculty must be willing to travel to campus.

#### Overview:

- The Longitudinal Clinical Skills Program is a new initiative within the PCP unit, which spans the first 18 months of the MD program.
- The program connects students with clinical faculty who are passionate about "back to bedside" clinical skills teaching and professional identity formation.
- The program is delivered in 2 parts:
  - PCP-EPOM: 16 weekly sessions on Thursday mornings from 8-11:00 am, through August – December, focusing on history-taking, medical ethics discussions, communication skills, presentation skills, documentation, and professional development in 1st year Weill Cornell Medical students. Urgently seeking additional clinical mentors to begin end of August 2025.
  - **PCP-HID:** 16 afternoon sessions over January June, and October December, focusing on organ-based physical exam skills, clinical reasoning, interviewing, communication and professional development. **Seeking faculty for the course beginning in January 2026.**
- Faculty are asked to commit to the entirety of one of these courses.
- Session guides and other curricular support is provided by the PCP unit leaders, and Clinical Skills Center faculty.

#### Responsibilities

- 1. Facilitate small group sessions (for PCP-EPOM and PCP-HID)
  - Two faculty co-facilitate learning for 10-12 students, involving history-taking, physical exam skills, medical ethics, clinical reasoning, documentation, and presentation skills
- 2. Bedside physical exam teaching (for PCP-HID only)
  - One faculty mentors a group of 5-6 students in bedside physical exam skills 2
    afternoons per month. These sessions are a part of the 16-session commitment
    during PCP-HID.

**Funding/FTE:** A stipend for this will be provided to faculty who participate in the entirety of PCP-EPOM and/or PCP-HID in recognition of the extended commitment and mentorship provided to preclinical students.

Faculty who have already volunteered to be a PCP-EPOM Clinical Mentor starting August 2025 and have committed for the entirety of the course are also eligible for this stipend.

- \$1250 for participation in the EPOM PCP program, beginning August 2025.
- \$1250 for participation in the HID1 and 2 PCP program, beginning January 2026.
