Weill Cornell Updates

Dean Robert Harrington



We are pleased to introduce Dr. Robert Harrington as the Stephen and Suzanne Weiss Dean of Weill Cornell Medicine and Provost for Medical Affairs of Cornell University, effective September 12, 2023. Dr. Harrington's appointment was approved by the Weill Cornell Medicine Board of Fellows and the Cornell Board of Trustees Executive Committee.

A highly regarded cardiologist, accomplished teacher and researcher, and exceptional leader with three decades of experience in academic medicine, Dr. Harrington has chaired Stanford University School of Medicine's Department of Medicine and acted as attending cardiologist at Stanford Hospital since 2012. Prior to that, he served as Professor of Medicine and Director of the Duke Clinical Research Institute at Duke University. He is a past president of the American Heart Association, a Master of the American College of Cardiology, and recipient of numerous national and international prizes for his cardiology research.

During one of the quarterly meeting of the Council of Affiliate Deans, the Dean was introduced to six of the Affiliates: Burke Neurological Institute, Lincoln Hospital, Hospital for Special Surgery, Houston Methodist Hospital, NewYork-Presbyterian Queens and NewYork-Presbyterian Brooklyn Methodist Hospital. Dean Harrington remarked upon all the news things he had learned and his intention to visit the affiliates in the coming months.

Developments at our Partners

Burke Neurological Institute (BNI)



At Burke Neurological Center, the mission is to cure disability by helping people think, see, move and feel again. Among the many initiatives at BNI this past year has been the installation of the Marshel Imaging System. James Marshel, PhD, with colleagues at BNI, has developed techniques which open up a whole new avenue for restoration of function in stroke, TBI, Alzheimer's disease, to name just a few. In addition, electroceuticals are defining a whole new field of brain repair therapeutics, by using electricity to stimulate residual circuits after injury to restore function. Dr. Marshel joined the faculty at Burke Neurological Institute and Weill Cornell Medicine in 2023, where he is expanding knowledge and approaches to reveal neural circuit mechanisms of visual perception and learned sensory behaviors.



Gracie Square Hospital (GSH)

Our newest affiliate, Gracie Square offers a unique advanced clinical elective in Inpatient Psychiatry. The elective introduces WCM students to the assessment and treatment of acute neuropsychiatric disorders in the inpatient setting. Students will interview patients, work with a multidisciplinary team to formulate a treatment plan using evidence-based practice. Students will also collaborate with outpatient providers and families and integrate psychoeducation with both patients and their families. At the end of this sub-internship, the student will have a good grasp of the fundamentals of inpatient psychiatry. **Dr. Smita Agarkar**, Associate Professor of Clinical Psychiatry is the faculty director and Service Chief at Gracie Square Hospital.





Gracie Square Hospital was proud and honored to officially announce the "LGBTQ+ Healthcare Equality Leader" designation from the Human Rights Campaign Foundation (HRC). This designation was awarded in the 16th iteration of the HRC's Healthcare Equality Index (HEI), released May 7, 2024. A record 1,065 healthcare facilities actively participated in the HEI 2024 survey and scoring process. Of those participants, 384 received the top score of 100, earning the "LGBTQ+ Healthcare Equality Leader" designation.

Houston Methodist Hospital (HMH)



Houston Methodist Hospital is honoring **Dirk Sostman, MD, FACR,** for his accomplishments as the President and Emeritus Professor Radiology and Ernest Cockrell, Jr. Presidential Distinguished Chair. In 1995, Dr. Sostman was appointed Professor, Chair, and Radiologist-in-Chief at the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center. He then served as Senior Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs (2001-2005), Executive Vice Dean (2003-2005), President of the NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital Medical Board (2004-2005), and Trustee of NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (2003-2005). In 2005, he became Chief Medical Officer, Chief Academic Officer and Executive Vice President at Houston Methodist. He served as Interim CEO of the Research Institute in 2010 and holds the rank of Distinguished Member in HMRI. Dr. Sostman was appointed President of the Houston Methodist Academic Institute in 2019 and is now Professor Emeritus of Radiology at Weill Cornell. HMH wishes Dr. Sostman well on his retirement.

Lincoln Hospital is enjoying the distinction of being designated the first baby-friendly hospital in the Bronx. In addition, Lincoln Hospital has been re-certified as a level one trauma center. Lincoln has the third busiest single site Emergency room in the country.



Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center (MSK)

Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center (MSK) and the Stavros Niarchos Foundation (SNF) announced the SNF Global Pediatric Cancer Program, a new initiative at MSK made possible by a transformative \$25 million grant from SNF as part of its Global Health Initiative (GHI). The SNF Global Pediatric Cancer Program aims to optimize outcomes for young patients globally by expanding clinical care expertise, educational and specialized training, and collaborative translational research.

MSK Kids, the pediatric oncology program at MSK, is the largest pediatric oncology program in the United States and a center of excellence for the comprehensive treatment of children, teenagers, and young adults with cancer and blood disorders. As part of this new program, MSK will create new relationships and build on existing ones with current SNF GHI partners, including Sant Joan de Déu (SJD) Barcelona Children's Hospital, where SNF supported the construction of the new SJD Pediatric Cancer Center; King Hussein Cancer Foundation and Center in Jordan, where SNF is expanding access for children in the wider region; and Yorkshire Cancer Research in the United Kingdom where SNF is scaling an exercise-based treatment program to improve outcomes.

NewYork-Presbyterian Queens (NYPQ)



NewYork-Presbyterian Queens is enjoying a banner year. The first and only Neuro Intensive Care Unit in the borough of Queens has opened there, in addition to new operating rooms, a simulation laboratory, and a medical research library. An expansion of community services, includes the debut of the Mom & Baby bus.

NewYork-Presbyterian Queens offers a Healthcare Leadership and Management Fellowship. Partnering with Envision Healthcare, the administrative fellowship is a comprehensive, hands-on look at the world of Emergency Medicine administration. Under the leadership of fellowship director, **Dr. Manish Sharma**, Chair, Emergency Medicine Department, this one-year fellowship gives physicians the opportunity to learn about healthcare leadership at the local, regional, and national level, while providing the flexibility to gain experience in a community, academic, and tertiary-care hospital. Fellows are given Weill Cornell faculty appointments as Clinical Instructors and teach medical students who rotate at NYPQ. The fellowship is also associated with a large Emergency Medicine management group allowing for the opportunity to gain practical experience.


Dr. Answorth A. Allen is the Associate Surgeon-in-Chief and Deputy Medical Director at HSS. In this capacity, he oversees and contributes to the hospital's orthopedic endeavors, reflecting his commitment to advancing patient care and surgical innovation. With over 150 articles and book chapters on shoulder, knee, and elbow problems, he has significantly advanced the understanding and treatment of orthopedic conditions.



Dr. Mathias Bostrom is Associate Surgeon-in-Chief, Director, Quality and Safety and Attending Orthopaedic Surgeon at Hospital for Special Surgery. He was the Program Director of the Orthopaedic Surgery Residency at HSS from 2005 to 2018 and Program Director of the Adult Reconstruction and Joint Replacement Fellowship from 2005 to 2019. He currently serves as the Executive Director of the International Society of Orthopaedic Centers (ISOC) and 2nd Vice President of the Hip Society. Dr. Bostrom's research largely focuses on periprosthetic joint infection, bone healing and implant osseointegration. He has published over 200 peer reviewed articles.



Dr. Stavros Memtsoudis is Chief of Anesthesiology, Critical Care and Pain Management at HSS. Triple fellowship trained in cardiac and thoracic anesthesiology as well as critical care medicine, He is world renowned for his extensive academic work and guideline development in the field of perioperative care of orthopedic patients. He was instrumental in establishing formal critical care services at HSS. As a Senior Scientist and Clinical Professor of Anesthesiology and Public Health, he founded an international research fellowship, published nearly 400 peer reviewed articles and has been the recipient of numerous prestigious academic awards. Dr. Memtsoudis has served as the President of the Society for Anesthesiology and Sleep Medicine and as Board member and Chair of the Research Committee for the American Society of Regional Anesthesia and Pain Medicine.



Dr. Lan Zhou is Neurologist-in-Chief and Chair of the Marcia Dunn and Jonathan Sobel Department of Neurology at Hospital for Special Surgery. Dr. Zhou is a nationally renowned neuromuscular specialist with a long history of clinical and academic accomplishments. Dr. Zhou is recognized as an outstanding educator and runs a National Institutes of Health–funded research program to study muscle inflammation, fibrosis, and regeneration associated with acute and chronic skeletal muscle injuries and repair.

Jennie G. Ono, M.D., M.S. Chief of Pediatrics at NewYork-Presbyterian Queens. Board-certified in pediatrics and pediatric hospital medicine, Dr. Ono has extensive experience and expertise in inpatient care, newborn medicine, and pediatric asthma. Dr. Ono is also a leader in research and education and has authored numerous prestigious publications on sphingolipids in asthma and hospital pediatrics. She joins NYP-Q from New York-Presbyterian/Weill Cornell Medical Center, where she most recently served as the Medical Director for Inpatient Pediatrics and the Director of the Pediatric Asthma Program.



Dr. Julia Cron is Site Chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology at New-York Presbyterian Queens. Prior to joining Weill Cornell Medicine/New York Presbyterian, Dr. Cron was the Residency Program Director for the Obstetrics and Gynecology Residency Program at Yale New Haven Hospital. Dr. Cron serves on the Exam Committee for the Council on Resident Education in Obstetrics and Gynecology and is a board examiner for the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and most recently served as the District I (New England) Junior Fellow Advisor for the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists.



Srikanth R. Boddu, MD, Director on Interventional Neurology at NewYork-Presbyterian Queens. Dr. Boddu is a pioneer in the minimally invasive endovascular treatment for pulsatile tinnitus & idiopathic intracranial Hypertension (IIH). His areas of clinical expertise include brain aneurysms, AVMs, arteriovenous fistulae, (DAVF) carotid stenosis, and intracranial atherosclerotic stenosis. Dr. Boddu also specializes in kyphoplasty and vertebroplasty for vertebral compression fractures in patients with osteoporosis, myeloma, and metastasis. He is board certified by the American Board of Radiology (ABR), the American Board of Neuroradiology (ABNR), and the American Board of Neurological Surgery (ABNS) for focused practice in CNS endovascular surgery. Dr. Boddu is a senior member of scientific societies such as the Society of Neurointerventional Surgery (SNIS), an active researcher, involved in multiple research trials, widely published in peer-reviewed journals, as well as a passionate teacher and mentor.



Baxter Ballantine Allen, MD, has been appointed as the Chief of Neuro Critical Care at NewYork-Presbyterian Queens and leads the Acute Stroke Service. Dr. Allen has a special focus on stroke, subarachnoid hemorrhage, traumatic brain injury, seizures, and neurological conditions. Active in research, Dr. Allen is currently studying traumatic brain injury leading to post-traumatic epilepsy, effective therapies for head injuries, and the detection of seizures.
